FireSmart 2024

Mark your calendar for these FREE public information FireSmart sessions at the SCL Hall:

Would you be ready if you were told you had 10 minutes to pack and be on the road out of town? The **March 17** session will give you a few pointers and reasons why you should give it some thought.

The FireSmart program is all about how to **protect your property** against a wildland fire. The **March 24** session will explain how to create a separation to protect your house when faced with fire – even just a grass fire.

Chainsaw safety on **April 7** will offer tips and techniques for working safely with a saw.

The annual **Community FireSmart Day** is planned for **Sat April 27**. This is an opportunity to dispose of trimmings and deadfall from your properties and also to come out and help clean up some public spaces in the community. Representatives from the SCL Community League will be at the info sessions to discuss plans and they will have a signup sheet for the **Community FireSmart Day event and BBQ** in April.

Beaver Hills Watershed Stewardship Society Update



The Stewardship executive has been working through the winter on a few ideas to set direction for activities this summer, and to set longer-term priorities for the group. We are planning a Public Engagement Event to be held at Birch Bay Ranch on May 25, 2024. This will be an opportunity for people to meet and tell us what they would like to see for the future of our very unique landscape. There will be presentations from folks who have dedicated many years studying changes that have taken place across the moraine. We will also have representatives from a variety of other organizations who have an interest in the Beaver Hills basin.

Having water in the system is obviously a key requirement. How to accomplish that is one of the things we want to tackle, but there are many more. Ecosystems related to wetlands, riparian zones, lake and stream water quality, birds and animals all need support through a watershed plan that would be recognized by government planners and decision makers. We are into a long-term project and we are looking for people with some time and passion to work with us as we formulate a plan for the next generation. We have projects that will fit anyone's area of interest and expertise.



Drop your recycling off in the bins at the Fire Station on the last weekend of every month.

Next dates: March 30 - April 7

A bin will be set up, one side accepting paper products and the other accepting containers.

Acceptable items include:

- corrugated cardboard (flattened, clean and dry)
- glass jars (food & beverage containers, lids removed)
- metal cans (aluminum cans and containers)
- mixed paper (inserts, flyers, cereal boxes, etc.)
- plastic containers (hard plastic only, clean, lids removed)
- newspaper

In an effort to ensure that these events are successful and continue, please put items into their correct bins and only drop off accepted items.
